Chair's Report

In the last edition of the Highlights, I updated you on the progress made to alleviate the recurrent flooding in the Parish.

In the last edition of the Highlights, I updated you on the progress made to alleviate the recurrent flooding in the Parish. I am pleased to report that although it seems as though the rain has not stopped since the beginning of the year, the incidence of severe flooding has. We do still have concerns in local areas and we are fully aware that the flooding which occurs in Mill Lane and the centre of Hellingly Village when the river overtops, may always be with us. It is nothing new, however we will continue to work with the relevant authorities to do what we can to alleviate the number of occasions when this occurs and the length of time the disruption lasts.

The Parish Council continues to work with the District Council and Southern Water to bring about a permanent solution to the sewerage problem in the area of Station Road. In our opinion it is undeniable that the connection of Roebuck Park, part of Uplands, and the several smaller local developments, is already causing an overload on the system which was installed in the last century to deal with a much smaller number of properties.

The addition of a further 350 new dwellings in Swingate Park (Park Farm East) not to mention the balance of the Uplands estate, and Danecroft will exacerbate the problem and that sooner rather than later, Southern Water has to accept responsibility and undertake a fundamental upgrade of the whole system.

The reality of their position is now becoming evident from the approach recently adopted by the District Council, at the instigation of Councillors, of refusing to discharge the drainage conditions attached to the grant of the planning consent for approval. The effect of this is to deny occupation of the new dwellings in the absence of satisfactory evidence being produced to show that the

drainage system can cope with the additional foul flows. It is difficult to see how this can be evidenced when the sewers in Park Road are still overflowing when we have heavy rainfalls.

On a happier note, the Council has recently completed the survey on its proposals to extend the lower Horsebridge Recreation ground. Following broad approval of the scheme consulted upon, the Council will now be refining the details before submitting a planning application and progressing with the work hopefully before the end of the year. In the meantime, arrangements are being made to open up the field behind the Kings Head for parking when the weather permits. This should alleviate the problems that arise with parking on the roads on match days.

Finally, we continue to work towards the take over of the public open space on the Burfield Grange Estate. Although the extent of the area to be transferred to the Council and the capital payment intended to offset the maintenance costs for the next 10 years was agreed some time ago our agreement was always on the basis that the area would be handed over in a good condition, with all works complete. On a recent inspection it was apparent that there were still matters to be completed. These were agreed with Bovis. Rather than complete the work themselves Bovis has asked that the Council undertake the work in return for a cash payment. We are obtaining quotes and as soon as these have been agreed we shall undertake the work and end this long running saga.

Sussex Wildlife Trust

Swifts by Michael Blencowe for Sussex Wildlife Trust.

These are uncertain times. Who knows where this planet is heading? But since the start of May I've been looking to the sky for a sign of reassurance: the return of the Sussex Swifts from Africa. Ted Hughes expressed it perfectly: "They've made it again / Which means the globe's still working, the Creation's / Still waking refreshed, our summer's / Still all to come."



Swifts may not look like much - they're basically two wings and a mouth - but it's hard to explain their abilities without making them sound supernatural. Swifts are all about flying. They feed, scream, and mate in the air and

bathe in the rainclouds. At night they switch off half their brain, switch on cruise control and fall asleep amongst the stars. If they had their way they would never come down. But there's one little flaw in their plan: eggs

don't float.

So, for just a few weeks of the year, they begrudgingly swap the open skies for a cramped nest under the eaves where they raise

their young. The problem is in recent years most of these little gaps have been lost to renovations and modern architecture. The destruction of their homes is one of the reasons why Swift numbers have fallen. They are refugees on the wind.

They cruised into Sussex in May after a non-stop, long-haul flight from Africa; not that this trip bothered them. Swifts are all about flying. For me, the Swift is the only bird that takes pure, unadulterated pleasure in flying. Other

birds fly out of necessity, but Swifts seem to fly for the joy of it, screaming with delight at the top of their little Swift lungs, a shrill cry that is forever associated with English summers.

By the time you read this, a new generation of Sussex Swifts, born in a roof cavity, have crawled to the nest entrance, and bravely launched themselves on their first flights. And what a first flight - they may not land again for two or three years! For these 'teenage' Swifts, the skies of Europe and Africa will be their playground. Nothing will tame them. Well, not until they meet a partner and decide to settle down in a roof of their own somewhere. But don't let this comfortable image of domestic bliss fool you there's no taming these Wild Ones.

Hellingly is a growing community and with the combination of beautiful countryside and urban life, it provides a wonderful area to live or visit. We hope that our website helps you get the most from this lovely area.

The Parish of Hellingly is located adjacent to the north-west boundary of the town of Hailsham. The Parish is mostly rural in character and is situated at the confluence of the River Cuckmere and Bull River, one of its tributaries.


Within the Parish boundary are the residential settlements of Lower Dicker, and Lower Horsebridge, as well as the original village of Hellingly which comprises of the Parish Church and cluster of homes some of which are listed for their historic interest. This area is designated as a conservation area. The new residential areas east of the original village are focused on Park Road, The Drive and New Road areas, and these areas continue to expand with many new homes expected over the next few years.

The Parish Crest was adopted following a competition amongst local residents and the winning design was created by Ron Pidgley. The crest is divided into four quarters. The upper left depicts the Village School, the upper right the Church tower and lower left the Cuckoo Trail and the lower right the Water Mill, all prominent local land marks. The crest appears on all Parish official documents and correspondence.

PARISH COUNCIL RUN FACILITIES

Hellingly Community Hub is a modern venue located on the Roebuck Park housing development, and has meeting, sports and event facilities which can be hired. The Parish Council offices are located in this building. The former Village Hall is located at the junction of North Street and Church Road and is used solely by a pre-school group.

There are three defibrillators located in the Parish. They are situated at the Kings Head Public House, Horsebridge, Hellingly Village Hall, North Street, Hellingly and at the Community Hub at The Drive. These are all checked regularly, and pads and batteries are replaced before they go out of date.



Hellingly Country Park originally formed the grounds of the old Hellingly Hospital and is a beautiful and peaceful area to walk around with mature tree specimens, secret style paths and lovely views. The park includes children's play facilities, a multi-use games area for ball games, a dog agility area, a cricket pitch and pavilion, ponds and woodland walks. Fishing at the top pond is allowed with a license within the fishing season of 16th June to 14th March every year. The surfaced paths are suitable for wheelchair users and pushchairs too. There is free parking for visitors at the adjacent Community Hub.

Lower Dicker Recreation Ground includes a children's play area and is the home to Hellingly Lions Cycle Speedway track and club. Lower Horsebridge Recreation Ground is home to Hellingly Bowls Club, Hellingly Cricket Club, Hellingly Rugby Club and Hellingly Houndogs American Football Club. There is also an enclosed play area for the children to play in a safe space and a large open space to run and play when the sports clubs are not using the grounds.

There are 25 allotment plots at Roebuck Park, should you wish to add your name to the waiting list and live on the Roebuck Park development please contact the Deputy Clerk, Tracy, on

In addition to these allotments there are approximately 90 plots at the Union Corner site, should you wish to apply for a plot here, please contact Tina via email at tina_jenner@outlook.com with your full name, address and contact telephone number.

Hellingly Cemetery is located on the east side of North Street, there is a War Memorial situated near the entrance where the Community join together on Remembrance Day in November each year. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission inspect the War Graves within the Cemetery annually.

Hailsham Town Council oversee the administration of the cemetery and for details and enquires contact them on 01323 841702 or email www.hailsham-tc.gov.uk

The Parish Council is also responsible for a small area along the Cuckoo Trail known as The Arboretum. This was planted in 2000 to mark the Millennium.

The Parish Council have memorial trees around the Parish including an Oak planted at the front of the Community Hub in recognition of Queen Elizabeth II's jubilee celebrations. There are also a number of memorial benches placed around the Parish, including in the Country Park and Hellingly Cemetery. If you wish to have a tree or bench placed in memory of a special person please contact the Parish Council.

PARK WOOD

Park Wood is one of the largest areas of unfragmented woodland in the Hellingly and Hailsham area and the entire woodland is designated ancient, semi-natural woodland. It has a long history of coppice management back to mediaeval times when iron smelting was an important local industry.

It is designated as a Local Wildlife Site, important for its species richness including a number of bat species, hazel dormouse, amphibians, reptiles, birds and bryophytes (plants). The woodland is highly valued by the local community both as wildlife habitat and as a place for a wide range of quiet informal recreation activities.

Park Wood is designated as an Asset of Community Value and is designated as openaccess under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act.

CUCKOO TRAIL

The Cuckoo Trail offers a 14 mile trail for walkers, cyclists and horse riders taking you through the beautiful East Sussex countryside. The trail is part of the National Cycle Network (Route 21).

The route was formally a branch railway line and the trail runs for 11 miles along the route of the old railway, linking the three large towns of Heathfield, Hailsham and Polegate. An extension south of Polegate takes the Trail to Hampden Park, near Eastbourne. There are three cycle access points onto the Cuckoo trail in the Hellingly Parish.

Being mainly off-road it is suitable and safe for people of all ages and abilities. The slight gradients and sloped accesses make the trail available to most mobility scooters and wheelchairs.

Benches are located along the Trail, many carved from fallen trees by local craftsmen. Picnic tables and bike racks are located at intervals along the Trail and there is a Wildlife Sculpture Trail laid out for a mile north of Hellingly village.

As the Cuckoo Trail is used for more than one activity, the following guidance is helpful:

- Walkers can use all of the Cuckoo Trail
- Cyclists can use all of the Cuckoo Trail but should dismount where signed.
- Horse riders can ride between Hellingly and the south of Heathfield and between Summerhill Lane south of Hailsham and Polegate. This latter section involves going over a bridge, which crosses the A27 Polegate bypass, where a mounting block is provided at each end.





Charities across East Sussex presented with High Sheriff's Awards

The High Sheriff of East Sussex, Mr Richard Bickersteth, hosted an Awards Ceremony at Hellingly Community Hub on Tuesday 12th March at which he presented High Sheriff's Awards to eleven local charities and five other organisations.

The awards were presented in the presence of the Chair of Rother District Council and the Mayors of Brighton & Hove, Eastbourne, Seaford, Newhaven and Peacehaven, and 120 other guests.



The High Sheriff was personally appointed by King Charles III as his representative for law and order, actively supporting the Judiciary, the Police and other law-enforcement agencies, the emergency services, local authorities and all church and faith groups.



He also takes an active part in supporting and promoting local voluntary organisations.

Every year the High Sheriff of East Sussex may make a number of personal awards to recognise and celebrate the work of charities



and organisations within the County who have made outstanding contributions to the communities in which they live or work.



Operation Downsway

Sussex Police have deployed an annual targeted operation to ensure drivers are safe on the road.

Operation Downsway launched in April in East Sussex and will run every weekend through the summer months.



The aim of the operation is:

- Reducing the number of people who are killed or seriously injured on the roads of East Sussex
- Reducing the number of reported incidents of anti-social driving
- Increase public confidence in local policing through increased visibility and patrols
- Target those individuals who are prepared to drive on the roads in an anti-social or irresponsible manner.

Every weekend between April and September officers from teams across the force will take part in the dedicated operation, providing a highly visible presence on the road network in Sussex and taking enforcement action where necessary.

Using a variety of tactics including the latest technology in automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) and drones, Sussex Police aims to reduce the "fatal five" factors which lead to people being killed or seriously injured on our roads.

The "fatal five" factors are: driving at inappropriate and excess speed, drink and/or

drug-driving, not wearing a seatbelt, careless and anti-social driving, and being distracted while driving such as by using a mobile phone.

Residents are also being encouraged to alert us to road safety issues that are impacting their communities.

WEALDEN CADETS RECOGNISED FOR THEIR WORK SUPPORTING VAWG

We are extremely proud to announce that National Crimebeat 2024 have awarded the Wealden Police Cadets a Commended Award for their project on the topic of VAWG (Violence Against Women and Girls). National Crimebeat, run by the High Sheriff's Association of England and Wales, focuses on innovative projects tackling anti-social behaviour, crime prevention and victim support.



Last month, the cadets presented their project to the Year 11 girls at Willingdon Community School in order to raise awareness on the topic, as well as ensuring the girls knew what to do should themselves or someone they know be a victim in the future. All students were provided with an information pack including leaflets,

personal alarms, reusable bottle tops and other anti spiking tools. This session coincided with the VAWG Spiking Intensification Week, where officers all over the district were out raising awareness of the issues of spiking.

The cadets aim to visit five other secondary schools across Wealden after the Easter break, to continue supporting and educating students with all their hard work and efforts.

RIDE CRAFT HUB FOR MOTORCYCLISTS LAUNCHES IN TIME FOR SUMMER

Sorry Mate I Didn't See You (SMIDSY)! It's a phrase commonly heard by motorcyclists who have come to a rapid halt when a vehicle pulls out in front of them.



These "SMIDSY" incidents are one of the leading causes of motorcycle collisions and the focus of a new campaign led by Surrey and Sussex Police as covers come off motorbikes ahead of the spring bank holidays.

Last year five riders died on the roads in Surrey and Sussex, including on busy Bank Holiday weekends, so the new campaign aims to equip motorcyclists to enjoy their holiday rides and get back to their garage safely; particularly if they've not ridden for a while over the colder months.



The new Ride Craft Hub website www.ridecrafthub.org curates tips and explainers from pro riders all aimed at helping motorcyclists be better on their bike, and to reduce harm to riders on the road. Motorcycle Officers will also be out sharing tip cards as they engage with riders over the Summer.

A guide to spotting a SMIDSY has also been provided on the hub by charity DocBike, who work to eradicate motorcycle deaths, as well as better cornering advice from Bikertek in collaboration with Motorcycle News, and a masterclass on reading the road provided by a blue light rider from Thames Valley Police.

Fired-Up Flavours for June

With summer beckoning, it's time to fire up the barbecue and indulge in the smoky, succulent delights of outdoor cooking.

BBQ MARINATED CHICKEN SKEWERS

Ingredients

200g halloumi cheese, sliced

- 1 red pepper, sliced
- 1 yellow pepper, sliced
- 1 courgette, sliced
- 1 red onion, sliced
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- Mixed salad leaves
- Cherry tomatoes, halved
- Fresh basil leaves, torn

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the barbecue grill to medium heat.
- 2. In a bowl, toss sliced peppers, courgette, and red onion with olive oil, balsamic vinegar, salt, and pepper.
- Grill the marinated vegetables on the barbecue for 8-10 minutes, or until tender and slightly charred.
- Grill the halloumi slices for 2-3 minutes on each side, until golden brown grill marks appear.
- **5.** Arrange mixed salad leaves, cherry tomatoes, grilled vegetables, and halloumi on a serving platter.
